MAS Guidelines

Objective and responsibilities

The interdisciplinary commission for Medical Anthropology *Medical Anthropology Switzerland* (MAS) promotes communication between representatives of different disciplines concerned with health and illness. It organizes symposia and colloquia and connects interested parties and scientific disciplines.

Membership

Any person or institution that is interested in the concerns of the MAS and is a member of the Swiss Ethnological Society (SEG) can become a member. According to Art. 6 of the SEG statutes, membership in this society is open to anyone who expresses an active interest in anthropology.

Organization

According to Art. 15 the SEG board appoints the committee of the commission; the term of office of its members is three years. The commission organizes itself and elects a committee. This committee fulfils the obligations towards the SEG (representation of the commission in the board, preparation of the annual report, budget and accounting) and is responsible for the future-oriented planning and conception as well as for the representation of the MAS towards third parties. The committee is supported by the members of the commission, who continuously work on content and organization, and by persons in a broader circle of interest (IKMAS), who are interested in the MAS events, but do not necessarily have to be members of the SEG.

Otherwise, the statute of the Swiss Ethnological Society (SEG) applies.
