Programme

The Benin Initiative Switzerland is dedicated to researching the provenances and historical contexts of the Benin collections in eight Swiss museums. The joint project is supported by the Federal Office of Culture. While the first phase (2021/22) focused on collaborative provenance research, the second phase (2023/24) dealt with communicating the research findings together with partners from Nigeria and the diaspora in Switzerland. This resulted in several exhibitions in Basel, Geneva, Neuchâtel, and Zurich accompanied by a rich programme of events and the joint publication *Mobilizing. Benin Heritage in Swiss Museums* (2024).

Two exhibitions on Benin opened simultaneously in Zurich in August 2024: the exhibition *In Dialogue with Benin: Art, Colonialism and Restitution* at the Museum Rietberg and the exhibition *Benin Dues – Dealing with Looted Royal Treasures* at the Ethnographic Museum at the University of Zurich.

The two institutions are organizing the *Forum: Restitution and Beyond* to reflect on these collaborative projects. Both museums have initiated a process for the possible transfer of ownership of their looted or likely looted Benin objects. The forum will evaluate the research and results of the Benin Initiative Switzerland in the wider context of cooperation and restitution efforts. International experts discuss new visions for museums and communities in both Switzerland and Nigeria.
